

Heritage & Produce Trail

Maitland, Morpeth, Gresford, Elderslie, Maitland.

Immerse yourself in Maitland with a self-guided drive. Starting in East Maitland turn into Melbourne St and follow the signs to Morpeth. Along the way in East Maitland an antique precinct presents a marvellous opportunity to purchase a piece of the past.

Arriving in Morpeth you will be presented with an array of shopping and dining options in this historic river port. Once you have finished exploring Morpeth cross the timber Bridge and head towards the charming rural townships of Largs and then Woodville. As you pass through Largs call in at the pub for a meal or quiet refreshment with the colourful locals, or make a stop along the way at one of the fresh produce stalls where friendly farmers stock plentiful offerings from their crops.

From Woodville continue onto Paterson where you can enjoy a leisurely stroll by the river, lunch in a charming café or spend some time at the museum for an insight into the history of the village.

Journey northwest from Paterson through Vacy to explore Gresford and East Gresford. Visit one of the boutique vineyards or enjoy a picnic at a scenic spot on the Allyn or Paterson Rivers. Travelling down Gresford Road you will enter Elderslie, where you take a left turn onto Stanhope Road.



At Lambs Valley you have two options:

1. Continue on to Maitland Vale Road and take the time to enjoy the tranquil atmosphere around Rosebrook and Maitland Vale. At Bolwarra Heights make sure to stop at the scenic lookout on your left for an overview of the lush riverflats back towards Maitland and Morpeth. End your drive in the Federation suburb of Lorn where you can take a self-guided heritage walk, dine al fresco or shop for something special in the tree lined main street.
2. Take the road south toward Luskintyre and Lochinvar where the drive finishes. Stops along the way encompass olive groves, a boutique cellar door and a selection of eateries from pub style to fine dining. Keep an eye on the skies for vintage Tiger Moths operating from the Luskintyre and Rutherford Airfields or you might even see a hot air balloon if driving early in the day.
